GEORGE

ANNIE Dad, wait. I don't know.

GEORGE You don't want to go?

ANNIE No. I do. It's just -

GEORGE Honey just say it. What's the big deal?

ANNIE

GEORGE

ANNIE

Too young? Dad, I'm 22. That's a year older than mom was when you got married.

GEORGE That is absolutely not true.

ANNIE

You're absolutely wrong.

GEORGE

That doesn't matter. Times have changed. Your mother was mature. 22 isn't what it used to be. It's hot in here. I thought you didn't believe in marriage. I thought a woman lost her identity. I thought you wanted a job before you settled down so you could earn money and be your own person.

ANNIE
